Monitoring & evaluation (Art 20)



- To guide the effective and efficient implementation of the regulation and foster country knowledge (mutual learning).
- Topics of specific interest:
 - (a) the implementation of the EIF by the Member States;
 - (b) the take-up of the interoperability solutions in different sectors, across the Member States, and at local level;
 - (c) the development of open-source solutions for the public services, public sector innovation and the cooperation with GovTech actors in the field of cross-border interoperable public services to be delivered or managed electronically in the Union.
- Focus on reuse and automated data collection.
- First evaluation after 3 years, and every 4 years thereafter.

Final provisions

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Costs & entry into force



Costs (Art. 21)

- Subject to the availability of funding, the general budget of the Union shall cover the costs of:
 - (a) the development and maintenance of the Interoperable Europe portal;
 - (b) the development, maintenance and promotion of the Interoperable Europe solutions;
 - (c) the Interoperable Europe support measures.
- These costs shall be met in compliance with the applicable provisions
 of the relevant basic act.



Entry intro force (Art. 22)

20 days after publication in Official Journal. Application 3 months after.
