	<ol> <li>For the purpose of determining the contribution towards the percentage set out in Article 86(2), Member States shall include the following types of interventions and their specific weightings differentiated on the basis of whether the support makes a significant or a moderate contribution towards one or more of the environmental and climate-related objectives set out in points (d), (e) and (f) of Article 6:         <ol> <li>100% for expenditure under the schemes for the climate and the environment, referred to in Article 28;</li> <li>100% for expenditure for environmental and climate-related management commitments, referred to in Article 65;</li> <li>100% for expenditure under the types of interventions in the apiculture sector, referred to in Article 49;</li> <li>a 100% for expenditure under these types of interventions referred to in Article 41 b for the fruit and vegetables sector relating to environmental and climate objectives ;;</li> <li>a 40% for basic income support for sustainability, referred to in Article 17;</li> <li>wii. 40% for expenditure under the Basic Income Support for Sustainability and the Complementary Income Support referred to in Title III, Chapter II, section II, subsections 2 and 3;</li> </ol> </li> <li>wiii. 40% for expenditure for natural or other area-specific constraints referred to in Article 66.</li> <li>For other types of interventions than those referred to in paragraph 1, Member States may include in their calculation expenditure for the interventions which exclusively contribute towards the environmental and climate-related objectives.</li> </ol>	We agree with the percentages established for the interventions mentioned and with the inclusion of the BISS and ANC with a contribution of 40%, in accordance with the percentage established in article 87. yii) Nevertheless, we consider that, according to article 87.2.a), payments complementary to BISS, should be taken into account with the same weighting (40%) in the case of interventions related to environmental and climate-related objectives (art. 86.a). In the specific caso of CRISS, there would also be a discriminatory treatment between MS applying CRISS and those which are not. These payments are: payment for small farmers, redistributive and payment for young farmers. (vii) . v) Furthermore, we consider that interventions exclusively related to environmental and climate objectives in the FRUIT AND VEGETABLE SECTOR should also be included, as they are specifically defined for these environmental and climate objectives under Article 41(b), and are also mandatory under Article 44(7)(a). For the other type of interventions not mentioned in paragraph 1, we can accept to only include those contributing exclusively towards the environmental and climate- related objectives as this could simplify the procedure and guarantee uniform application throughout the EU. However, our acceptance

	would be contingent on the single percentage determined on paragraph 2 of article 86.
