# Introduction



### Scene Setter

- Third political trilogue: 26 April 2021
- EP premises, but chaired by the Council
- Heads of delegations:
  - EP: Rapporteurs: Johan Van Overtveldt and Henrike Hahn
  - Council: Chair of FiCo WP, Rui Henrique Alves
  - EC: Commissioner Elisa Ferreira
- Agenda:
  - Agreement on technical work
  - Exchange of views on remaining issues





# Exchange of views



## **Budgetary aspects**

#### Resources

(art. 4, lines 67-70, 72)

- Financing is the one contained in the original COM proposal and Council position.
- Bilateral EP and COM declaration.

#### Climate conditionality for the funding

(art. 4a, lines 76-77)

- EP dropped its intentions.
- Lines deleted.

#### Technical assistance

(art. 4, line 74; art. 6, line 86; art. 10, line 111)

- Envelope increased from 25 to 35 million euro.
- At least 10 million to support administrative capacity of the beneficiaries.

#### Less developed regions

(art. 4, line 74; art. 6, line 86; art. 10, line 111)

- Co-financing rate increased from 20% to 25%.

Availability of resources (art. 6, lines 85-86; rec. 13, line 34)

- Competitive phase to start in January 2026.



## Delegated acts vs. implementing acts

- EP would like to have delegated acts for:
  - The selection of finance partners other than the EIB (art. 13a, line 125 and rec. 20, line 45)
  - Work programmes (Art. 13: lines 123, 123c)
- Council (and COM) clearly against.
- Agreement:
  - Implementing acts for both issues.
  - Work programmes set award criteria in the event that resources would be insufficient to support eligible projects and establishes a hierarchy of those criteria.



# Gender impact assessment / Monitoring financial viability / Other issues

- The interim evaluation will assess: (i) how the horizontal principles in article 3a have been taken into account; *(ii) the need to carry out gender impact assessment*; (iii) the application of the eligibility criteria (art. 8); and (iv) how the publicity obligations have been applied.
  - EP proposal was to include "whether it is appropriate to amend the eligibility criteria to include provisions on gender impact assessment" (line 143).
- In annex II, data will be broken by region and gender only "where relevant" (line 215).
- In order to prevent excessive burden, this was accepted against EP dropping its intentions on monitoring financial viability (rec. 15a, line 39)
- The outcome of all technical work (9 technical trilogues) was agreed.





# Outcome and Follow-up



#### Outcome

- Provisional agreement reached a balanced "package"
- Within the boundaries of the Council mandate no red lines were crossed:
  - No joint declaration on financial resources;
  - Climate conditionality not included;
  - No delegated acts.
- Compromise was needed for some issues:
  - Envelope for technical assistance: slight increase (25 to 35 millions);
  - Co-financing rate for the case of less developed regions: idem (20% to 25%);
  - Gender impact assessment: reference in article, but with softer language.
