New Status Agreements were signed with: North Macedonia (October 2022), Montenegro (May 2023) Albania and (September 2023). They allowed new deployments in North Macedonia and Montenegro. The one with Albania allows for application provisional from 5 March 2024 (New deployments under the new Status Agreement: in the coming months discussion on the new operational plan already very advanced).

A final agreement on the text of the Status Agreement with Serbia was reached in March 2024. Signature of the new Status Agreement by Commissioner in Serbia in the coming weeks. Tentative timeframe for additional deployments under the new SA: in 2024.

As part of the regional protection-sensitive migration management programme project, Frontex has increased its support, with training of return escorts, ongoing gaps assessment of return case management system, workshops with MS dedicated experts to engaging with specific countries of origin.


- Provide diplomatic support in improving the return/readmission cooperation of the Western Balkans with the main countries of origin and transit, notably by concluding their own bilateral readmission agreements.
- A NL Seconded National Expert has been deployed at EU Delegation to Serbia as of 2 April to provide support to Serbian authorities on returns.
- Frontex to continue to support the Western Balkan partners e.g. with deployments of return specialists, on return case management systems, return counselling, on working with countries of origin, training and facilitating the acquisition of travel documents. Frontex may deploy a return coordination officer to Serbia provided Serbian authorities agree (answer pending since September 2023).
- New regional IPA programme to cover both voluntary and non-voluntary returns for a total of MEUR 13 under





Overall commitment to visa alignment expressed by all WB partners through the joint statement endorsed at the EU-Western Balkans Justice and Home Affairs ministerial in Nov 2022 and in October 2023 and in bilateral meetings in the margins of these ministerial meetings.

The Tirana Declaration endorsed at the EU-Western Balkans Summit of 6 Dec 2022 stresses the need for swift visa policy alignment.

The Brussels Declaration endorsed at the EU-Western Balkans Summit of 13 December 2023 welcomed the progress made on alignment with EU visa policy by several Western Balkan partners and called for further alignment to prevent abuse of EU Member

Annex 1 - Common messages to the Western Balkan partners

[General support]

- Welcome the dynamic and recall the long-standing and close partnership between the EU and Western Balkan partners and express the EU's desire to continue and deepen this mutually beneficial cooperation, built around shared priorities.
- Express the commitment to maintain and further strengthen the EU-Western Balkan relations in line with the EU's enlargement policy.
- Emphasise the EU's political commitment to strengthening its relationship with the entire Western Balkan region, including in the Home Affairs area, and particularly with regard to border management, asylum and reception, return and readmission, the fight against smuggling and visa policy alignment, in line with the EU Action Plan on migration for the Western Balkans.
- Highlight promising outcomes of Ministerial Forums in Tirana in 2022, Skopje in 2023, and the need to put them in practice.

[Socio-economic support]

- Highlight the Economic and Investment Plan for the Western Balkans. European Commission has unveiled a substantial BEUR 3.2 investment package to support transport, digital, climate and energy connectivity projects in the Western Balkans. The projects are designed to bring tangible benefits to all six partners in the region.
- Point out that the Economic and Investment Plan is set to mobilise up to EUR 30 billion of investments. The Plan will help close the development gap between the European Union and the region and support the post-pandemic economic recovery.
- Underline that the EU is providing humanitarian and development assistance to many of the key countries of origin from which migrants usually flows to the Western Balkans as well as to persons displaced from Syria and Afghanistan to neighbouring countries.
- Underline EU support to ensure that guarantees and protection will be provided to vulnerable groups of people in transit countries.

[Priorities in the field of migration management]

- The EU remains committed to provide capacity building, with the aim of Western Balkan partners' taking full ownership of their asylum and reception systems. In the meantime, the EU is committed to continue providing material, technical, financial and operational assistance to ensure that the asylum and reception systems of Western Balkan partners are able to manage increased migration flows, while ensuring democratic values, respect for human rights and the rule of law.
- Emphasise the great importance to align visa policies in the region with the EU visa policy and ensure the implementation of commitments by Western Balkan partners in this regard.
- Stress the importance of accurate migration situational awareness and timely exchange of information.

- Underline the importance of adopting a comprehensive approach to migration governance, which entails tackling the root causes of irregular migration, combating migrant smuggling and trafficking in persons, ensuring dignified and sustainable return and reintegration, and other aspect of migration and mobility.
- Highlight the importance of awareness-raising and information campaigns which draw migrants' attention to the opportunities, risks and measures undertaken.
- Promote the increased joint operational efforts and coordination between EU Member States, Western Balkan partners and countries of origin to disrupt smuggling networks.
- Emphasise the regional EU-funded 'Anti-Smuggling Operational Partnership' that was launched to strengthen cooperation through joint investigations, stronger exchange of information, joint training for law enforcement and the judiciary and capacity building. The Operational Partnership will build on several ongoing initiatives, including the 'Common Operational Partnership' (SCOPE) and the operational activities under EMPACT.
- Highlight that the implementation of the regional anti-smuggling and trafficking action for the Western Balkans worth MEUR 36 has started (June 2023), with the objective of strengthening cooperation on police operations, investigations and prosecutions.

[Border management]

- Emphasise the increased EU support for border management in the Western Balkans.
- Highlight the need to improve the coordination and implementation of planned measures based on the European Integrated Border Management (EIBM).
- Underline that negotiations of Frontex status agreements with and Bosnia and Herzegovina should be concluded as a matter of urgency.
- Highlight that the Commission is implementing an assistance package worth MEUR 39 under the Instrument for Pre-Accession Assistance (IPA III) to strengthen border management in the Western Balkans, mainly through the provision of specialised equipment and the operationalisation of migration facilities.
- Further insist that Western Balkan partners improve management of arrivals at airports, to mitigate consequences of visa free regimes.

[Return and readmission]

- The EU is committed to create a holistic approach to return management and cooperation on readmissions, including sustainable support for reintegration in countries of origin.

- Underline that EU and Western Balkan partners agreed on the importance of returns and implementation of readmission agreements with an emphasis on the need to enhance asylum and reception systems across the region in line with EU standards.
- Highlight that the EU is willing to support and facilitate cooperation on return, readmission and sustainable reintegration between Western Balkan partners and the main countries of origin of irregular migrants.
- Highlight importance of efficient implementation of readmission agreements with WB neighbouring countries, notably in the area of shortened/accelerated procedures
- Highlight the importance of efforts under the Joint Coordination Platform (JCP), which aim to support and coordinate operational measures implemented in the Western Balkans region, in particular in the field of returns and readmissions.
- Underline the EU's readiness to assist in building capacities with knowledge and skills on different aspects of return, readmission and reintegration.
