Subject:	Draft IPA III Regulation:  – examination of the outcome of the latest technical meetings on recitals (1)-(12b)

Possible compromises on recitals (1)-(12b) of the draft IPA III Regulation were discussed with the European Parliament in the technical VTC meeting on 9 July 2020. The outcome of these discussions and updated compromises are indicated in the fifth column of the table.
