Comments by Germany

German comments with regard to the Commissions' "Proposal for a Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Directive 2008/106/EC on the minimum level of training of seafarers and repealing Directive 2005/45/EC:

§ 5b para. 1 and para. 3:

We would like to ask the Commission for clarification about the purpose of inserting regulation § 5b para. 1 and para. 3 into the directive.

According to our understanding of STCW, certifiates of proficiency, documentary evidence and medical certificates shall be accepted by administrations of MS if the certificates comply with the requirements of STCW.

What are the legal consequences and/or changes that come along with the insertion of § 5b para. 1 and para. 3 for national administrations regarding the verification and acceptance of certificates of proficiency, documentary evidence and medical certificates, compared to the legal situation today?

§5b para. 2:

We suggest the inclusion of a passage clarifying that certificates of competency shall only be endorsed by administrations if all requirements of the Convention have been complied with, as stated in Regulation I/2 para. 7 STCW.

§5 para. 6

We would like to ask the Commission for clarification why the provision contained in § 5b para. 6 does not apply to radio officers and radio operators. In our understanding this new provision refers to Regulation I/10 para. 5 of the STCW Convention, where on the contrary, no such exclusion is contained in.
