Introduction and background

- LEWP-P: Need for an overview of the law enforcement networks and expert groups affiliated with the LEWP-P.
- In the 2nd half of 2022, the Czech Presidency in close cooperation with France and Sweden (the trio-presidency at the time) decided to compile key information on the LEWP-P affiliated networks into one comprehensive document (12908/22 REV 3).
- In the 2nd half of 2024, the Hungarian Presidency re-launched the debate on the future of the LEWP-P affiliated networks and follow-up on the work done by several LEWP-P affiliated networks.
- During the LEWP-P meeting of 4 December 2024, the Commission asked Member States to provide guidance on the networks that should be prioritised, for example taking into account EU law enforcement priorities and EMPACT priorities.
- During the Polish Presidency, the LEWP-P discussed the future of two LEWP-P affiliated networks (EUCPN and ENAA) and follow-up on the work done by several LEWP-P affiliated networks.

Setting up a temporary core group

The Danish Presidency proposes the establishment of a **temporary core group** tasked with proposing to the LEWP-P:

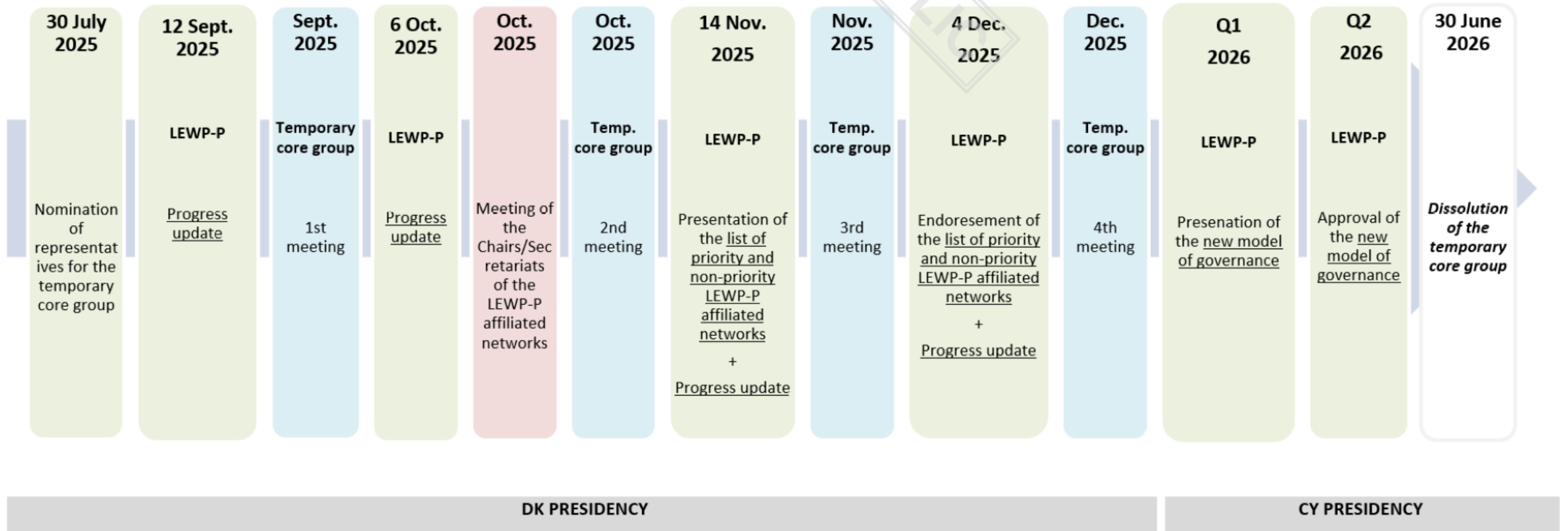
- a) a draft list of priority and non-priority LEWP-P affiliated networks; and
- b) a new model of governance for the LEWP-P affiliated networks taking into account the documents prepared during the Czech (12908/22 REV 3) and Swedish Presidencies (10195/23).

The Danish Presidency proposes that the temporary core group be given one year to carry out these tasks, i.e. until the end of the Cyprus Presidency.

Member States wishing to participate are kindly invited to nominate one representative to the temporary core group.
