Subject:	Ad hoc Working Party on the ECHA Basic Regulation (AHWP ECHA): creation and mandate - Approval

- 1. On 8 July 2025, the <u>Commission</u> adopted the proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on the European Chemicals Agency and amending Regulations (EC) No 1907/2006, (EU) No 528/2012, (EU) No 649/2012 and (EU) 2019/1021('ECHA Basic Regulation') COM(2025)386.
- 2. The proposed legislative act aims to:
 - provide the European Chemicals Agency ('the Agency') with an autonomous legal framework;
 - enhance the Agency's governance and its financial sustainability;
 - enable the Agency to carry out the tasks allotted to it in current legislation and allowing
 its tasks to evolve to accommodate the new tasks envisioned by already adopted or
 planned Commission proposals;
 - ensure that the Agency can react effectively to new challenges and provide better support to the Commission, Member States and duty holders;
 - modernise the Agency, including by taking into account the principles of the Common
 Approach in its planning of activities.
- 3. The proposal is inherently cross-sectoral. The widespread use of chemicals, along with their associated risks to human health and the environment, is reflected in the scope of the Agency's tasks under Article 4 and Annex I of the proposal, which address chemical safety across multiple sectors and Union agencies, as well as in the many aspects of their use. In order to effectively address the cross-sectoral matters covered by the "ECHA Basic Regulation" proposal, and to carry out the preparatory work linked to the examination within the Council, the Presidency proposes to establish, in accordance with Article 19(3) of the Council's Rules of Procedure¹, an ad hoc Working Party (AHWP) on the "ECHA Basic Regulation" ("AHWP ECHA") in order to involve experts from the different sectors concerned such as environment, trade, employment, health and food safety.

Council Decision of 1 December 2009 adopting the Council's Rules of Procedure (2009/937/EU).

- 4. Under the authority of the Permanent Representatives Committee, the AHWP ECHA will report to the "Environment" configuration of the Council as well as, where appropriate, to the "Employment, Social Policy, Health and Consumers" configuration of the Council, "Competitiveness" configuration of the Council, and "Agriculture and Fisheries" configuration of the Council.
- 5. The AHWP ECHA will operate in accordance with the mandate set out in the Annex to this note and will draw on the expertise of delegates working in the relevant areas, where appropriate. It will cease to exist upon the adoption of the final legislative act based on the proposed ECHA Basic Regulation or upon decision of the Permanent Representatives Committee. The mandate of the AHWP ECHA may be updated or revised, including its possible extension, in order to carry out the necessary legislative or non-legislative preparatory work related to the proposed ECHA Basic Regulation.
- 6. The AHWP ECHA will carry out its tasks in close coordination and avoiding duplication with other preparatory bodies of the Council.
- 7. In this context, the <u>Permanent Representatives Committee</u> is invited to approve:
 - the establishment of an Ad hoc Working Party (AHWP) on the ECHA Basic Regulation ("AHWP ECHA");
 - the mandate, as set out in the Annex to this note.
